### ▼ **Recognizing the Spectrum of Disabilities**

One recurring theme in the conversation was the recognition of the diverse spectrum of disabilities. critical aspect of the conversation centered on societal mindsets. The call was not only for legal compliance but for creating equal opportunities and breaking down the stereotypes associated with disability.

### ▼ **The Power of Collaboration and Advocacy**

Throughout the discussion, the power of collaboration and advocacy emerged as driving forces for change. Participants stressed the importance of NGOs and various stakeholders working together to test and refine assistive technologies. They underscored the need for more voices, especially those of PWDs, in decision-making processes to ensure that interventions are effective and meaningful.

### ▼ **Looking Forward: Revolutionizing Livelihoods**

As the conversation neared its end, participants shared their visions for revolutionizing livelihoods for PWDs in India. The consensus was clear – a united effort involving government, society, and industry is essential. The importance of integrating the goals of persons with disabilities into broader Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) was emphasized. The focus was not just on charity but on creating a more integrated landscape where PWDs are active participants and contributors.
